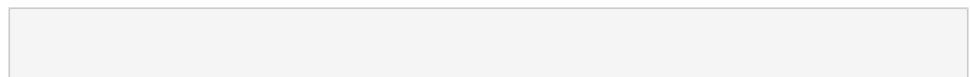

Christy Anderson is Associate Professor of Art History at the University of Toronto. She is an architectural historian with a special interest in the buildings of Renaissance and Baroque Europe. As a Kress Fellow at the Courtauld Institute of Art and later as a Research Fellow at Worcester College, Oxford, she studied the annotations made by the English architect Inigo Jones (1573-1652) in his collection of treatises and humanist literature. This work on literacy, architectural language, and the construction of the professional architect appeared in her book *Inigo Jones and the Classical Tradition* (Cambridge, 2006). Her new work, supported by a fellowship from the John Simon Guggenheim Foundation, explores the meanings of architectural materials in early modern Europe.
